MEMORIAL PARK

Memorial Park is a favorite place for Houstonians to enjoy the great outdoors and one of the largest urban parks in the country. Opened in 1924, the park was named "Memorial" to honor the soldiers who fought in World War I and trained at Camp Logan, a U.S. Army training camp previously located on what is now Memorial Park.

Today, Memorial Park is among the best places to visit and a great free things to do in Houston year-round. The impressive park spans nearly 1,500 acres inside the 610 Loop, a 38-mile freeway that loops around the inner city. For perspective, Memorial Park is nearly double the size of Central Park in New York City.

Houston's Memorial Park has something for everyone: golf, tennis, swimming, croquet, volleyball, skating, running and mountain biking trails, picnic space, a playground and so much more.

COCKERELL BUTTERFLY CENTER



The Cockrell Butterfly Center and Brown Hall of Entomology provide entertainment and education for the whole family. Walk through a living butterfly habitat, marvel at spectacular live and preserved specimens of some of the world's largest and weirdest arthropods, and enjoy interactive games and quizzes.

HOUSTON ZOO



Located within Hermann Park, the Houston Zoo is one of the city's busiest attractions, especially for families. But it wasn't always. When it first opened in the 1920s, the zoo had only a small fence and a few species of animals. As the park grew, so did its popularity, and it draws in millions of visitors each year. In addition to the animal exhibits—some of which are interactive—the park has a splash pad, playground, and carousel. However, the best times to visit are in the winter and fall, when the weather is cool and the zoo puts on themed activities.

DOWNTOWN AQUARIUM



Houston's Downtown Aquarium is a little like visiting three attractions at once. Located on the northern edge of downtown, this 500,000-gallon facility has a wide variety of aquatic animals, shows, and interactive exhibits — including four rare white tigers. A small amusement park outside boasts, among other things, a Ferris wheel overlooking Houston's downtown skyline. And an upscale restaurant features a floor-to-ceiling aquarium, where diners can watch sawfish, rays, and huge schools of colorful fish swim past tables while they eat.

COLOR FACTORY MUSEUM



Welcome to Color Factory: a collaboratively-produced art experience in Houston, Texas! This multisensory exhibit, inspired by the colors of the city, guides visitors through 12 participatory installations. Featured collaborators include: NASA, Soo Sunny Park, Alicia Eggert, HotTea, Harvey & John, Mary Ramos, Andrew Neyer, Andy J. Pizza, Michelle Rial, Art & Olfaction, Project Color Corps, Christine Wong Yap, Abby Clawson Low, Hypno, Carra Sykes, James Akers, Tout Suite, and Aqua S. Highlights include floating orbs that demonstrate the Bernoulli Principle, an interactive light and sound installation, a palette of colorful treats featuring anti-gravity ice cream, a unique activity on color and human connection, a giant Night Bright, and — of course — Color Factory's signature ball room. CHILDREN'S MUSEUM HOUSTON



Among the modern-looking buildings of the Houston Museum District, the Children's Museum Houston stands out from the crowd—a whimsical take on classic Greek architecture with its cartoonish bright yellow columns and pediment inlaid with mosaic tiles. Its inviting entryway is just the beginning of a fun journey. Kids and their adults can enjoy permanent and rotating exhibits, plus engaging interactive experience that happen year-round at the museum.

THE MENIL COLLECTION



The Menil Collection is a museum and neighborhood of art spanning 30 acres in the heart of Houston. The main gallery building anchors the campus and is surrounded by four additional museum buildings.

The Menil houses nearly 19,000 paintings, sculptures, prints, drawings, photographs, and rare books.

Masterpieces from antiquity, the Byzantine and medieval worlds, Africa, Oceania, the American Pacific Northwest, and the 20th century are particularly well represented. Among the highlights of the museum are its Surrealist holdings, widely regarded as one of the world's foremost collections of its kind.

MUSEUM OF FINE ARTS



With more than 65,000 pieces of art spread out over multiple campuses, the Museum of Fine Arts is one of the largest art museums in the country. The permanent collection features pieces from six continents spanning thousands of years and myriad genres, and temporary exhibitions always offer something new and interesting to see. Be sure to swing by on Thursdays for free admission all day and a happy hour that starts at 5 p.m. Visitors can grab a drink or exhibition-themed cocktail at the bar and a bite from a visiting food truck before taking in the museum's collections.

THE HEALTH MUSEUM



The Health Museum is an interactive science center and a member institution of the Texas Medical Center.

Take a larger-than-life walking tour of the Amazing Body Pavilion and get an up-close look at the human body and how it works. Ride a bicycle with a skeleton find out how hard your heart works to pump blood and sit on giant teeth!

Join fellow museum visitors in a learning environment that allows investigation into the who, what, when, where, and how of you at "You: The Exhibit."

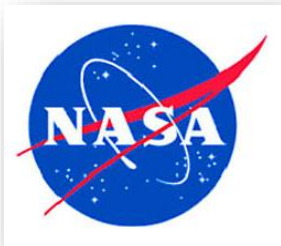
MUSEUM OF NATURAL SCIENCE



Founded over a century ago, the Houston Museum of Natural Science is one of the oldest cultural institutions in the Museum District.

The museum is home to several interactive permanent displays, as well as a constant rotation of traveling exhibitions, a planetarium, and an indoor butterfly garden. But the most popular stop inside the HMNS is the Morian Hall of Paleontology. The massive exhibit spans 3.5 billion years of history and features dozens of mounted fossils accompanied by realistic renderings of the animals displayed.

NASA SPACE CENTER



Space Center Houston is a must-visit for fans of space exploration. With more than 400 space-related artefacts and numerous interactive exhibitions, you can easily spend a whole day learning about NASA's history and current work. Be sure to hop on the tram tour too, which takes you around the real site of the Johnson Space Center, including the original Mission Control room and a behind-the-scenes look at the astronaut training facilities.

GALVESTON ISLAND PLEASURE PIER



Galveston Island Historic Pleasure Pier "Featuring waterfront fun and entertainment like no other Gulf Coast destination, features family-oriented attractions including rides, midway games, a wide selection of food venues and retail shops. Pleasure Pier is one of the few spots in the world that has this many rides over the water! You'll be flying over guests on the Pier, soaring over the Gulf of Mexico and anticipating your next ride! Whether you're hungry for funnel cakes, turkey legs, pizza, hamburgers or hot dogs, you'll find just what you're looking for.

KEMAH BOARDWALK



This amusement park overlooking Galveston Bay is the thing of childhood dreams. Kemah Boardwalk features jaw-dropping thrill rides like roller coasters, spinning swings, and free falls. There are also tons of gentler rides for younger kids and mild-mannered parents. A 65-foot Ferris wheel offers a great view of the water, and an adrenaline-inducing boat ride races passengers around the bay at breakneck speeds. Along the boardwalk, visitors can fuel up at several restaurants and shops before heading back out to play carnival games or partake in hands-on exhibits. It's pure, unadulterated fun and a great stop for families.
